
Cosmetology

What preparation will this program give me?

The Cosmetology Program is designed to prepare students in all phases of Cosmetology. The program consists of 1600 clock hours training in theoretical foundations; manipulative skills; business knowledge; professional and ethical practices. Graduates are qualified to apply for licensing through the California State Board of Barbering and Cosmetology.

What kind of job will I be qualified for when I finish?

Most graduates become cosmetologists. A cosmetologist's work might include: hair styling, coloring and cutting, manicuring, makeup artistry, beauty product sales and training, or other cosmetology services.





What classes will I take?

The Cosmetology Department offers either Daytime or Evening Cosmetology Program.

Overall employment of barbers, cosmetologists, and other personal appearance workers is projected to grow slightly faster than the average for all occupations. Opportunities for entry level workers should be favorable

The Evening program classes are the same as Daytime except the Cosmetology Laboratory courses are 5 units each (rather than 7) and students must additionally take either

What degree will I receive and how many course credits will I need?

Students can obtain either a Certificate or an Associate in Arts Degree. A Certificate is given after satisfactory completion of the 51 units of required coursework. An Associate of Arts degree is given after satisfactory completion of the 51 units of required coursework plus 19 additional general education and elective course units.
