Recreation and Travel Studies

What preparation will this program give me?

The Recreation and Leisure Services program qualifies students for a variety of positions in recreation and leisure leadership. Students who complete the requirements may also transfer to a four-year institution.

The Travel/ Tourism Industry program prepares students to work in the travel agency as a whole, not just as a travel agent. Students can develop the skills needed to get a job within six months to one-year. In addition to the traditional program, students can obtain specialty certificates in such areas as adventure travel and air travel.

What kind of job will I be qualified for when I finish?

Graduates of the Recreation and Leisure Services program will be qualified for a variety of positions in recreation and leisure leadership. These positions can be located in municipal, private, commercial and industrial recreation agencies, park services, therapeutic recreation services, and youth serving agencies.



The Travel, Tourism Industry program trains students for employment in a growing industry that includes jobs with airlines, hotels, tour operators, travel agencies, cruise lines, adventure companies, convention bureaus and more. The Certificate of Completion program prepares students for careers such as retail travel agent, tour operator, tour escort, and cruise consultant. The one-semester Certificate of Achievement prepares students for quick employment in a variety of entry-level positions within the Travel/Tourism Industry such as: reservationist, assistant to a travel counselor, or travel documentation clerk.
