

Steps for Transformation Shared Governance sharing

One Shared Senate

-Document being developed of comparisons of the 4 senates structure from their constitutions

Differences

- Representation
 - Divisional, (one from each campus?)
 - Departmental (one from each campus if enough faculty - according to Laney constitution?)
- Meetings (move back and forth? Always at one campus?)
- New constitutions - very different as to quorums, representation - need to be worked on for unified senate
 - Laney just had first reading on revising their election timeline/details

-Timing

- No changes for next (26-27) year
 - Discussions on changes occurring in spring 26, fall 26,
- First readings on proposed new Constitution ????
- Constitutional convention held? August 2026?

Other changes

- DAS membership: Total number and number from each college?
- voting and representation at ASCCC (currently 5 - 1 per college and DAS)
- From ASCCC Area B rep on needed steps

In short, ASCCC representation is tied to recognized member academic senates. Under [Article II Section 1 of the ASCCC Bylaws](#), only academic senates that are recognized by their local governing boards as representing faculty in the 10+1 (academic and professional matters) may hold ASCCC membership.

Once the unification takes place, it is likely a new academic senate would be formed and recognized by the governing board under title 5 [§53202\(a\)](#) and [Peralta's AP 2511](#). After governing board recognition, the new senate could apply for ASCCC membership following [ASCCC Policy 10.04](#).

Shared Governance committees

- Document developed of different committees (Dec DAS agenda)
- Framework for discussions?
 - Should we identify which committees should be same across district,
 - explore why some are different structures and should be preserved?
 - convene discussions among those committee members? Or surveys?
 - look at charges that are overlapping?

- in shared college/different campuses
 - maintain the separate committees and each campus reports out in district level?
- different campuses have different needs (ex technology/facilities - BCC one/two buildings versus spread out colleges of CoA/Laney/Merritt)
